

## Things to Pack:

Sleep-ware and robe  
Slippers and flip-flops (for around the 4-H Center)  
Sweater(s) or sweatshirt(s) (we'll discuss weather before we leave)  
PCS Class T-Shirts – **GREEN ON THE 6<sup>th</sup> ORANGE ON THE 7<sup>th</sup>!**  
Socks, Undergarments (several of each... please... we're away for 4 days!)  
Jacket (it can be chilly in the morning/at night)  
Raincoat and/or umbrella – hope for dry weather!  
**Comfortable** shoes or sneakers (at least 2 pair)  
Watch/time keeping device  
Sunglasses/Hat  
Toiletries (toothpaste, shampoo, deodorant, etc...)  
Other personal care items  
Jeans, pants, skirts, shirts, blouses  
Clothes for show at The Kennedy Center (see below)  
Comb, brush, hairdryer  
Camera/film/batteries  
Luggage – one (1) Medium-sized bag – one (1) Carry-on  
(both labeled with name)  
Approx. \$75 in spending money  
Postcard stamps (if you plan on sending any)

**NOTE:** Clothing that is acceptable for school is acceptable for the trip. Footwear should be comfortable, supportive and broken-in - we urge you to have comfortable shoes or sneakers. Sandals and/or flip flops (besides being a “safety issue”) are not comfortable for the tremendous amount of walking we will be doing.

**For the evening we will be going to The Kennedy Center** (Thursday, May 7<sup>th</sup>) we are requiring you to “dress-up” a bit. This is not expected to be a formal event we'd just like to look neat for the visit. Other guests at the theater will be in shirts w/jackets/ties/dresses.

Here are our **minimum** expectations:

**For boys** - a pair of dress or khaki pants and a polo/button down shirt would be appropriate. **For girls** - a pair of dress pants/khakis or a skirt would be acceptable along with a “dressy” shirt or blouse.

**All school clothing rules apply to the above.** (The Pomfret Board of Education Dress Code Policy has been included in this packet.) If there are any questions regarding appropriate attire please contact Mrs. Dion. Remember: The general rule of thumb – “if you need to ask if something is appropriate to wear – it probably is not.”
